

Questions & Answers for the “Uniting Community Voices in Overtown that Inform Policies and Decisions” Request for Proposals (RFP)

1. What are the geographical boundaries of Overtown?

We recognize that there are various formal and informal definitions of Overtown’s boundaries, and that communities cannot truly be defined by strict geographical lines. For the purpose of this RFP, the Overtown Common Good Initiative recognizes the geographic boundaries of Overtown to be: to the North, NW 20th Street; to the South, NW 5th Street; to the West, the Miami River and SR 836; and to the East, the East Coast Railway and NW 1st Avenue.

2. When would signed Memorandum of Understandings for partners be required to be submitted?

If required at all, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between collaborating partners will not be necessary until after funding decisions are made. If you have a collaborative partner and have shared responsibilities, we will trust that the agreement to work together has been made prior to submitting a proposal, and we will ask for signed agreements if we think they are necessary, after awarding funds.

3. If we want to collaborate with other people on this webinar, or offer our services to others, (i.e., Catholic Volunteers and the County), how do we contact each other?
