

Overtown Common Good Initiative Investments

Prepared June 26, 2017

- \$40,000 granted to Catholic Volunteers in Florida for Building Community Capacity
- \$100,000 for the Fellowship for the Common Good
- \$600,000 granted to the Overtown Children and Youth Coalition (OCYC) to help build a professionally staffed organization responsible for implementing a Master Plan which is a comprehensive and community wide effort to improve outcomes for children and youth in Overtown
- \$645,000 to Catalyst Miami to develop a safe network and provide outreach and capacity development services for the residents and organizations in Overtown.
- \$250,000 to Stephanie Creates to support an advocacy network in Overtown through community outreach and engagement, and social media public relations.
- \$5,000 for the Development of the OCYC Strategic Plan
- \$5,000 to Mt. Olivette Missionary to secure and protect the church's AC equipment from vandalism.
- \$42,500 to Catholic Volunteers in Florida for the placement of two full time volunteers at the OCYC
- \$3,135 to help obtain expert advice that would strengthen its 2015-2020 Master Plan
- \$5,000 to Booker T. Washington High School Class of 2019 for a college tour in Georgia.
- \$1,200 to the Miami Foundation for community stakeholders to attend Philanthropy Miami 2017
- \$5,000 to sponsor the OCYC's community meeting/reception that examined the collective impact model and discussed how best to achieve neighborhood-based change in Overtown
- \$5,250 to Independent Sector for registration for seven of the OCYC's members to attend the Independent Sector 2015 National Conference in Miami to support their professional development and networking efforts
- \$5,000 for OCYC community meeting to examine the collective impact model and discuss how best to achieve neighborhood-based change in Overtown
- \$2,500 to sponsor the Overtown Music & Arts Festival – Youth Zone which engages the community and youth within the community in further conversation related to identifying assets, priorities, challenges and needs
- \$2,500 to support Youth Economic Development Conference, an interactive platform to engage young people around critical issues of youth employment
- \$500 to support Urgent Inc.'s connection to the YouthBuild conference in Los Angeles in the fall of 2014
- \$1,000 to sponsor Girl Power's 4th Annual Gala
- \$1,560 to sponsor scholarships for eight Overtown stakeholders to attend Miami Philanthropy Day on March 5, a day-long educational and networking opportunity
- \$5,000 to sponsor Camillus Health Fair for the Overtown community
- \$1,050 to support Overtown community partners to cover expenses, including honoraria, associated with an educational tour of Overtown led by Dr. Marvin Dunn
- \$500 to offer Cooking for Life event highlighting their efforts to create sustainable school-wide cultures of health in Miami-Dade
- \$4,217 for three Members of the Council for the Common Good to attend the Homeboy Network Gathering
- \$5,000 to World Literacy Crusade of FL/Girl Power STEAM Summer Camp. The Camp will teach science, technology, engineering, arts and math to middle school girls in Overtown
- \$3,600 to Touching Miami With Love Ministries, Inc. for professional development of their Overtown staff
- \$5,000 to support Urgent Inc.'s 3rd Annual Florida Youth Economic Development Conference & Expo in Miami, July 13-15, 2016
- \$5,000 to the Overtown Optimist Club for capacity building

- \$1,000 to the City of Miami for the Overtown Community Resource Fair and Backpack Giveaway where over 500 backpacks will be given away to low-income elementary, middle and high school students living in Overtown for their back-to-school needs
- \$5,000 to Florida International University for the Booker T. Washington Edible Food Forest project where youth will be engaged in urban farming and learn sustainable living skills and healthy food options
- \$1,000 to sponsor the Girl Power 15 Year Anniversary Celebration. For over 15 years, Girl Power has provided programs and services that help young girls reach their full potential
- \$2,500 to Florida International University for four students to attend Black Brown College Bound Conference in Hillsborough County, Florida
- \$1,170 to The Miami Foundation for registration for six Overtown stakeholders to attend Leave A Legacy's Philanthropy Miami Conference
- \$5,000 to Camillus Health Concern to support the Camillus 9th Annual Health Fair held for over 400 Overtown community residents on April 9, 2016. The fair provided residents with the opportunity to be tested for diabetes, cholesterol, high blood pressure and connect them to a medical home
- \$1,250 to support Florida International University/Education Effect's Turkey Drive for Positive Family Involvement
- \$1,000 to support Camillus Health Concern's 17th Annual Hope for all Gala
- \$5,000 to support Overtown Optimist Club who sent 98 youth participants from their Cheerleaders Team, Dance Team and 2 of 8 Football teams to compete in Regional Competition in Orlando Florida in November 2016, with another chance to make it to Nationals in December 2017.
