At its September 2017 meeting, the board of directors approved funding to support the communities we serve in response and recovery from Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria. To date, we've awarded \$379,000. The following are a list of funded organizations:

Florida/Texas:

- \$20,000 Catholic Charities, Archdiocese of Houston-Galveston
 - case management, employment training, long term recovery and basic needs supply distribution

- \$50,000 Community Foundation of Tampa Bay
 - collaborative funding process for multi- county support

- \$25,000 Miami Foundation
 - for community-based response partnership

- \$60,000 Palm Beach County Food Bank
 - for generator

- \$45,000 Tampa Bay Healthcare Collaborative
 - disaster preparedness capacity building for nonprofits

- \$25,000 United Way of Palm Beach County
 - collaborative funding process for county-wide support

- \$60,000 United Way of St. Lucie County
 - collaborative funding process for county-wide support for facility repair and restoration

- \$50,000 United Way of St. Lucie County
 - collaborative funding process for county-wide support for basic needs

Caribbean:

- \$10,000 Catholic Relief Services
 - cleanup, housing and general relief in Caribbean non-US territories (Antilles, Cuba and Dominican Republic)

- \$10,000 Catholic Charities USA
 - cleanup, food, water, hygiene products, medicine, and transportation for mental health professionals to work in Virgin Islands

- \$10,000 Esterlyn's House
 - roof repairs and school supplies for two high schools in St. Thomas and St. Croix

- \$10,000 Glasscock Family Foundation
 - water filtration systems and shipping costs for relief supplies to St. Croix

- \$4,000 Wholesome Community Ministries
 - matching grant to support Convoy of Hope an international humanitarian relief organization and their disaster relief efforts in Puerto Rico, Caribbean and Mexico.
