



**Common Good Initiative Investments – Lincoln Park
As of June 30, 2023**

Through Allegany Franciscan Ministries, the Lincoln Park Council for the Common Good has invested more than \$7.8 million to support community-identified priorities and community activities in Lincoln Park. In the current fiscal year (beginning July 2022), \$813,300 has been invested. The funds awarded this fiscal year are listed below; prior year investments are available for review at www.afmfl.org.
